First Reading

Hebrews 5 : 1-10

¹Every high priest is selected from
among the people and is appointed to
represent the people in matters
related to God, to offer gifts and
sacrifices for sins. ²He is able to deal
gently with those who are ignorant
and are going astray, since he himself
is subject to weakness. ³This is why he
has to offer sacrifices for his own sins,
as well as for the sins of the people.

⁴And no one takes this honor on
himself, but he receives it when called
by God, just as Aaron was.

⁵In the same way, Christ did not take
on himself the glory of becoming a
high priest. But God said to him,

“You are my Son;
today I have become your Father.”

⁶And he says in another place,
“You are a priest forever,
in the order of Melchizedek.”

⁷ During the days of Jesus' life on earth, he offered up prayers and petitions with fervent cries and tears to the one who could save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. ⁸ Son though he was, he learned obedience from what he suffered ⁹ and, once made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him ¹⁰ and was designated by God to be high priest in the order of Melchizedek.

⁴¹ When the ten heard about this, they became indignant with James and John. ⁴² Jesus called them together and said, "You know that those who are regarded as rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. ⁴³ Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, ⁴⁴ and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all.
